Keynote Speaker: Economist Dr. Lynn Michaelis



The U.S. Growth Rocket is Fueled: Will it Launch?

Everything is finally in place for U.S. economic growth to accelerate through 2017. When the U.S. economy dropped into the “Great Recession” in 2008 due to a financial crisis, the Federal Reserve (Fed) cut short term interest rates to zero and started pumping liquidity into the banking system at an unprecedented rate to avert a depression. They succeeded. Concerns about runaway inflation proved and hopes for strong economic rebound proved unfounded. The recovery has been downright anemic, with economic growth averaging a paltry 2%/year for 2009-14. Employment just recently passed the 2007 peak level. Inflation remains near 2% as well, with deflation being a major concern in Europe.

First, Dr. Michaelis will address the three of the primary reasons why growth has been so sluggish. Then we will look closely at the recent developments which set the stage for sustained and accelerating economic growth through 2017.

Next, he will tackle THE question in the financial news almost every day: What will the Fed do to insure growth and inflation do not become a problem? How soon will they act? Will those actions abort the recovery?

Finally, he will address the international events that complicate the timing of the launch and the type of trajectory. Weaker growth in Europe and China, plus the surging U.S. dollar, could dampen growth in U.S. manufacturing, as export growth stalls. Those same factors are having a dramatic impact on global commodity prices, such as oil and metals. Prospects for oil demand and supply will be a key topic of conversation.

Dr. Michaelis is the President of Strategic Economic Analysis, LLC and the Partner at Forest Economic Advisers (FEA). Dr. Michaelis received both his Ph.D. and M.A. in Economics Washington State University.

Breakfast Speaker: Joe Sowards, Tucson Police/FBI Terrorism Task Force



Detective Karl “Joe” Sowards has over 35 years experience in law enforcement. He began his career with the Mesa, Arizona Police Department in 1976.

In 1988, Joe had a unique opportunity to join the Sedona, Arizona Police Department as their first Detective Sergeant. Sedona was a newly incorporated town and was starting their own police department. Joe played a major role in organizing and establishing the Sedona Police Department. In 1990, the Tucson Police Department made him an offer he couldn’t refuse and he transferred there as a Lateral Police Officer.

Over the course of a life-long career in law enforcement and intelligence, Detective Sowards has worked several specialized assignments, to include eight years in Homicide, and several years in Undercover Narcotics, DELTA, Special Investigations and Intelligence, Vice, Gang and Organized Crime, and Terrorism.

In 2007, Joe was handpicked as the first member from the Tucson Police Department to be a Task Force Officer on the FBI’s Joint Terrorism Task Force – or – JTTF, in Tucson. He has been “on-loan” full time to the FBI for the past seven plus years.

Among other activities within his assignments in law enforcement, Joe has been a General Instructor at Quantico for JTTF Orientation and National Security, on the Board of Directors of Arizona Homicide Investigators Association, and a Defense Tactics Instructor for the Tucson Police Department.
